

## CHICAGO REGIONAL MEETING MINUTES

Jill Quinto opened the meeting of the Chicago Regional Human Rights Authority (HRA) at 5:02 p.m. The meeting was held at Madden Mental Health Center, Hines, IL.

Chairperson Jill noted that a quorum was present. Jill read the Confidentiality statement.

Approval of Meeting Minutes for February 15, 2011: Kamil made a motion to accept the minutes; the motion was seconded and carried.

### NEW BUSINESS

#### New Complaints:

#11-030-9015 The complaint alleges that the facility allowed the police to question the recipient after her admission although they did not have a warrant. Also, the recipient asked for outside advocacy but was told that she had to go through the hospital's patient advocate. A motion was made to accept the complaint for investigation. It was properly seconded and passed.

#11-030-9016 The complaint alleges that the facility began sending the recipient out for psychiatric evaluations after a staff person reported to the police that she had seen another staff slap the ward while she was showering. Also, the guardian states that the hospital sent her ward to a facility that was not qualified to care for her. A motion was made to accept the complaint for investigation. It was properly seconded and carried.

#11-030-9017 The complaint alleges that the facility placed the recipient in restraints and when she urinated on herself the staff refused to clean her. The recipient also alleges that she was administered psychotropic medication because she complained. Also, the recipient alleges staff were unresponsive to simple requests for bath towel, aspirin, etc. A motion was made to accept the complaint for investigation. It was properly seconded and carried.

Katherine made a motion to go into closed session at 5:20 p.m. pursuant to Section 3955/21 of the Guardianship and Advocacy Act to discuss reports and responses and other matters which could not be discussed without revealing confidential information. The motion was properly seconded and carried.

The HRA returned to open session at 5:47 p.m. having taken no action in closed session. A summary of the closed session included assignment of cases, progress reports on open cases and discussion of responses for #09-030-9019 Lakeshore, #10-030-9011 Chicago Lakeshore, #10-030-9020 Swedish Covenant, and #11-030-9005 Chicago Lakeshore.

#10-030-9022 Alden. A site visit was held 3/16/11. The HRA requires further information that is currently being reviewed by the hospital's general counsel. The report is forthcoming.
